DELIVERY OF PROTESTS: All protests must be received electronically via email by 3:00 p,m. PST, Friday, May 2, 2014. Protests should be transmitted by a means that will objectively establish the date the City received the protest. Protests or notice of protests made orally (e.g., by telephone) or by fax will not be considered. Protests must be sent via email to: civic.engagement@sfgov.org by the above date and time to be considered. An electronic response confirming receipt of the protest will be sent within 24 hours of receipt of the original message. The subject line of the email protest should read: Protest RFP #2014-03 Community Safety Program Grants.
