In Dr. Morales' presentation he discussed the plan and issues the panel in Berkeley had when stating their program. At the start of their program they created plans for best practices and establishing criteria for funding programs or grants.

 - a. Presentation on San Francisco Health Improvement Partnership (SFHIP) and the Shape Up San Francisco Coalition 2015-2016 Report- Reducing Consumption of Sugary Drinks in San Francisco: A Collective Impact Approach
 - b. Co-Chair Roberto Vargas gave a high level presentation on this report. Mr. Vargas discussed the highlights of the report and reviewing what has been done to date. In his presentation, he discussed the strategies of the report.
 - Identify, support, implement and evaluate awareness, education, and promotion activities to decrease sugary drink consumption and increase tap water consumption.
 - ii. Identify, support, implement, and evaluate policy, systems, and environmental changes such as local and state policies, organizational wellness policy, and increasing access to water.
- 9. Proposed Use of \$200,000 from Previous Fiscal Year Budget [Discussion & Action]
 - a. The committee discussed and voted to recommend the amount of \$200,000 (money unallocated from the previous year):
 - i. \$200kfor DPH, in the following buckets**:
 - 1. \$28k for data on purchasing behavior
 - \$50k for community outreach to elicit input on short- and longterm spending recommendation strategies (should also inform marketing/education)
 - 3. \$122k for marketing/education, including:
 - a. Tax education and materials for corner store owners
 - b. showcasing the benefits of water stations
 - c. initial marketing/storytelling + development of longer-term campaign
 - 4. **all money should be spent in accordance with the SDDTAC's principle of serving underserved and impoverished communities.
